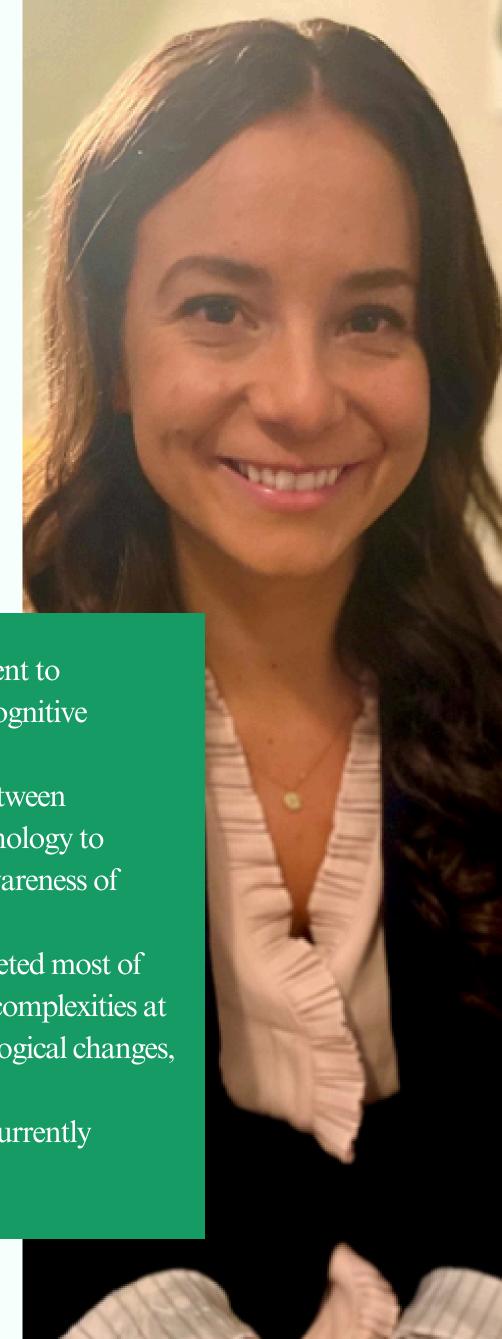

## Janeca Woody Cooper

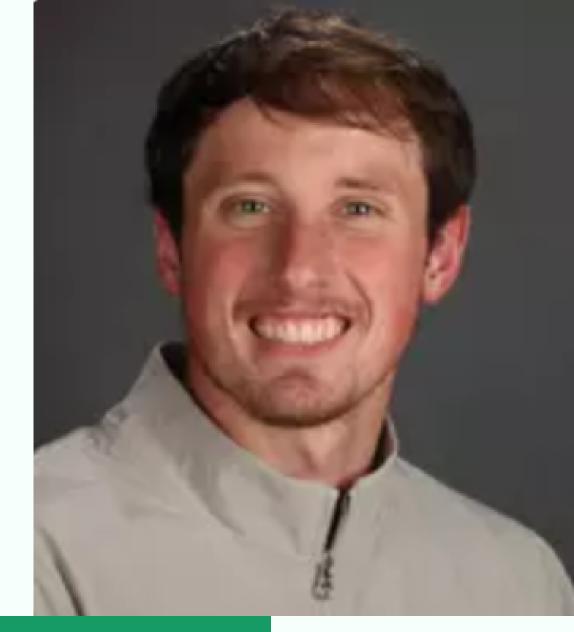
CHAIR, CONA
