A "program" consisting of one individual may join as a full member of the council if the individual is a professional geropsychologist who provides didactic and/or experiential geropsychological training as a core part of their work that assists trainees in meeting one or more of the Pikes Peak competency areas. Alternatively, an individual may join as an associate member if these conditions are not met.

Associate Members:

Training entities, including both programs and individual trainers, that show significant interest and substantive involvement in geropsychology training even though the training entity does not meet criteria for full membership. Associate members do not have voting privileges.
